#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Students will learn measuring, pattern drafting and basic sewing techniques. Hand sewing skills will include decorative traditional embroidery techniques such as satin stitch, feather stitch, blanket stitch, and the French knot; overhand stitch with welt, baseball stitch and running stitch. Students will learn to operate a basic sewing machine and a serger. Students will apply skills learned and follow quality control standards to complete a needle/fabric/thread chart, stitch samples, a beading mat, a bird mural and gauntlet mittens.

#### LEARNING OUTCOMES

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- develop and demonstrate the decorative hand and machine sewing skills of appliqué and a variety of embroidery stitches and techniques
- design and construct projects using hand stitches and machine sewing techniques
- develop quality control standards for each project
- prepare products for marketing

### **COURSE FORMAT**

This skill-based course will be a total of 45 class hours and will be taught using hands-on learning techniques, small group work, class discussions, elder involvement, peer learning, demonstrations and audio-visual aids.
