



What are Citations?

Citations (also called references) are descriptions of books, videos, periodicals etc. that include information you will need to find that item. It is important to be able to identify each part of a citation. Most citations include the title of the work, names of authors, publisher's name and location, and date of publication. Periodical citations also include the title of the article, volume and issue numbers, and the page numbers corresponding to the article.

Citations can be found in library catalogues, bibliographies and periodical indexes. You will need to know how to recognize and use citations if you want to write bibliographies, order interlibrary loans, search for books in a library catalogue, etc.
